## STEPHENTOWN HERITAGE CENTER HAS REOPENED



## Heritage Center Ceiling Repair is Complete

The Stephentown Historical Society has returned to the Heritage Center on Garfield Road, now that the ceiling repair is complete. Adam Squires has done an expert job in repairing the sagging ceiling and restoring the decorative ceiling tiles. For the better half of 2010, the Historic Society held its monthly meetings at the Stephentown Fire Hall on Garfield Road while the Heritage Center was under renovation.

## **Assessment of Historical Collection**

During the ceiling repair, the Historical Society's Collection was moved down to the first floor. Bev McClave, Curator, and her assistants reviewed the items and some pieces were deaccessioned. The collection was carefully recorded and returned in The sagging ceiling of the Heritage Center on Garfield Road has been carefully repaired by Adam Squires, a Stephentown contractor who specializes in Historical Restoration. 

#### 2010 ANNUAL REPORT

In 2010 Patricia Flint completed her final year of a second two-year term as President. The Society mourned the loss of much admired Trustee and Newsletter Editor Sandy Hamer in July. Her seat on the Board was left vacant to the end of the year.

#### Finances

The Society closed the year in relatively good shape despite the unexpected expense of reconstructing the ceiling at the Heritage Center. The year end totals for both income and expenses were better than expected. Income, budgeted at \$14,975, actually ended up at \$16,826 thanks to higher than expected memorial donations and improved income over last year from the Fund Drive and from the Community Tag Sale and recycling of deposit bottles and cans.

Operating Expenses were \$5,414 less than budgeted. Capital expenses, reflecting the ceiling repair and budgeted with \$4,000 for a roofing fund, showed a loss of \$4,710. The unexpected expense means that the fund established to replace the roof, work that will have to be done in the next few years, will have to be replaced with fund raising.

#### Maintenance, Repairs & Construction

A sagging ceiling above the Heritage Center balcony area was propped up early in the year with a temporary reinforcement but it soon became apparent that the entire ceiling was in imminent danger of collapsing. Doug Williamson and Carl Taubl constructed a temporary support wall on the balcony to forestall the collapse. Adam E. Squires Construction & Restoration Services won the bid to complete the reconstruction work which involved removing the tin ceiling panels and plaster and lath, refastening or replacing the furring strips and removing the insulation above. He installed new insulation and vapor barrier and constructed a new ceiling and refastened, caulked and repainted the tin panels. He also constructed a two foot wide catwalk running the length of the attic, and, to prevent any further sagging, installed steel ties connecting the furring strips to the joist timbers throughout the entire ceiling area.

Construction was completed in August. Bev McClave and

her team then began the process of deaccessioning some of the items that had been cleared out of the balcony area and returning the rest back up there. Program meetings were held at the Town Hall and the Fire Hall from May through November. The Potluck Dinner in December was held at the newly restored and cleaned Heritage Center.

#### Web Site

Webmaster Dick Rhindress continued work on overhauling the Society's website. Much work was done on the Cemeteries section which now contains most of the data from the Living Gravestones card file that was earlier converted to machine readable form by Pat Flint. The website contains descriptions and locations of all the cemeteries in that file along with information on the persons buried. Pictures of gravestones from most of the larger cemeteries are included and work will continue in 2011 to add more pictures.

#### **Town Historian**

Upon the recommendation of Bev McClave, Thomas Laier of Saddleback Ridge Road, was appointed Town Historian in January. The position had not been filled for over 20 years. Laier, whose ancestors settled in Sand Lake in 1765, is a certified History, English and Elementary teacher with degrees from the State University in English, History and Education.

#### **Fundraising Events**

#### Strawberry Festival

About 200 people enjoyed strawberries, shortcake, ice cream, homemade pie and chocolate-covered strawberries under the tent at the Strawberry Festival on June 27. It was hot, humid, cloudy, but no rain. Bill Zimmerman notes that we have now served over two tons of strawberries in the 29 years of this event.

#### **Community Tag Sale**

Wonderful weather brought out a horde of early shoppers and pickers on August 28 to Gardner's Field for the Community Tag Sale. A lot more volunteers this year made the load lighter and their cooperation was very much appreciated, as was the leadership of Bev McClave and Libby Kogan in coordinating the event.

#### **Giffy's Barbecue**

We hosted the second annual SHS Giffy's Barbecue on September 19 in conjunction with the Fire Department's Muster Day.

The Trip in September was to the Firefighters Museum in Hudson and the newly renovated Olana, home of artist Frederic Edwin Church, followed by ice cream at the Dairy Queen.

#### Elections

Elections of Officers and Trustees for 2011 were held in December. Marilyn Osgood was elected to a first term as President, Bill Zimmerman to a second term as Treasurer and Linda Sullivan to a second term as Corresponding Secretary. Janet Edwards and Patricia Mohos were both elected to first terms as Trustees.

#### Thanks For The Help

In closing, I would like to thank the officers and Board members and the many volunteers who helped to accomplish what we did over the past four years. Some of what I think are the highlights:

#### In 2007

• The first Historic Road Challenge was held, organized by Bev McClave, Tammy Madden, Sandy Hamer, Judith Pierson and Ellen Jennings, a lot of fun for participants who had to find the answers to local history questions. It was followed by a turkey dinner with all the trimmings. Support provided by many local business sponsors made this a successful fundraiser, well as a fun event.

#### In 2008

- Thermal insulating clear panels were installed over the inside of the existing windows of the Heritage Center by Advance Energy Panels of Hoosick Falls. The cost was covered by an additional grant from the Town of Stephentown.
- We fixed the leak in the steeple replacing the shingles with new high quality metal shingles over a complete new layer of ice and water roofing.
- We installed a new sign in front of the building thanks to Trustee Fred Haley and Kevin Doherty of the Montauk Sign Carving Co.
- A donation of \$1,000 from an anonymous donor in memory of Jake and Lillian Houghtling was used to purchase 40 new padded chairs.
- A beautiful display case was constructed by Rick Gillespie and installed in the Stephentown Post Office. Bev McClave and others have been changing the displays periodically.

#### In 2009

- Reprinting of Historical Albums #1 and #3 by Troy Bookmakers was completed. The digital versions will be archived so that additional copies can hereafter be printed as needed.
- Bruce Hankle completed reconstruction and painting of the south side storm windows.
- In partnership with the Girl Scouts, a spacious shed with a lockable door was built at the Transfer Station for refundable bottles and cans.
- The Town provided assistance in correcting drainage problems in the driveway.
- Celebration of 225 years on Stephentown Charter Day, March 29, included a skit by Stephentown Elementary students re-enacting the signing of the Charter, presentation of a commendatory resolution from the County Legislature and a Power Point slide show by Lorri Parisi and Pat Flint, followed by olde-tyme refreshments from vintage recipes.
- The Society designed and ordered t-shirts and new note cards to commemorate the Anniversary.
- A photo contest was held to provide historical pictures for a 2010 SHS Calendar. Twelve photos were selected and 100 copies of the 2010 Calendar were ordered.
- The Society participated in the 4th Annual Rock, Rattle & Drum Powwow and Spirit on the Mountain Music Festival put on by Fidel Moreno and Susan Jameson of Healing Winds and attended by some 6,000 people.
- As part of a combined SVFD Muster and 225<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration, the Society entered a float in the parade – with the Stephentown El-
- ementary Charter signers returning and put on a Giffy's BBQ at the Muster.
- Dick Rhindress became Webmaster and began overhauling our website and setting up a new, orderly and efficient way to handle the Society's email business. He is committed to keeping the much improved website up to date.

Sandy Hamer passed away on July 31, 2010 after a courageous 5-year battle with cancer. ## Calvin Atwater 1926-2011



Calvin B. Atwater, 84, of Presbyterian Hill Road died on Thursday, January 20th at his home. He was born on June 22, 1926 in Stephentown, NY to John and Hazel Atwater. He grew up in Stephentown and graduated from New Lebanon High School in 1944. Cal served in the US Army Air Force from 1944 to 1947 with the rank of Sgt Major. Cal married his high school sweetheart

Virginia (Wilt) Atwater on March 6, 1948. Mr. Atwater worked for his uncle in the lumber business and in the late 1940's he and his brother Will formed Atwater Bros., a construction company. For many years Cal worked for Lebanon Valley Speedway doing track maintenance and as the "Pit Steward". In 1990 he retired from the NLCS district after 20 years of driving bus and working in the transportation department. In retirement, Mr. Atwater spent many years caring for the Garfield Cemetery. Mr. Atwater was a member of the Stephentown Veteran's and Stephentown Historical Society. He is a lifelong member of the Stephentown Federated Church. A graveside service at the Garfield Cemetery will be held in the spring.
