

Sunday, June 22, was another sunny, early summer day in Stephentown, a great day for the Stephentown Historical Society's 33rd annual Strawberry Festival at the Berry Patch. Bev McClave and her crew served some 225 people on a pace to set attendance and sales records. Unfortunately we ran out of strawberries around 2 o'clock, 2 hours before our scheduled closing.

The reputation of our Strawberry Festival has been growing, so expectations have also



grown along with our customer base. Unfortunately our picking and hulling crews have grown smaller in recent years, so we had only 140 pounds of strawberries, about 70% of our needed inventory.

A sincere thank you goes to our pickers, hullers, servers, and other contributors who made the 33rd annual Strawberry Festival a success.
